FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Do I have to be able to speak Japanese to participate?

No. It is helpful to know a little Japanese, but it is not a requirement. However, this program is a great opportunity to learn Japanese and practice with the host family.

Does the student or family need to be members of the ESGVJCC?

No.

Do we have to host students?

In order to gain the full experience of the program, each family is required to host one or two Japanese students in August 2017. Hosting a Japanese student is a remarkable experience that the entire family can benefit from.

What activities will we do while in Japan?

The activities are different each year. Typically, the group will visit local historic sights, visit a Japanese junior high school, visit Edo Mura (theme park), and eat lots of great food! There are also two free days planned by each students' host family.

Are the students accompanied by any adults?

Yes. Throughout the entire trip to Japan, at least two adult chaperones will accompany the students. These chaperones will be responsible for the students during travel and while in Ohtawara. While the students are with their host families, the chaperones will remain locally in Ohtawara and will be reachable by telephone.

Do we have to attend any meetings before the trip?

There are approximately 3-5 planned meetings before the trip to go over passport information, Japanese customs, what to expect in Japan, *omiyage*, and anything else needed for the trip. These meetings are mandatory.

How much does the program cost?

The program costs approximately \$2,000 which includes airfare, housing, transportation, food, and activities while in Japan. We encourage the students to fundraise throughout the year to help offset the cost of the trip.

How do I sign up?

Complete a student exchange program application (available through the ESGVJCC Office). Application must be accompanied by a \$200 non-refundable deposit. There is a limit of 12 slots.

What if my student needs to cancel?

If a student has to cancel and cannot attend the trip for any reason, written cancellation must be submitted on or before March 7th in order to receive a full refund. Cancellations after March 7th will incur a more significant forfeiture. The \$200 deposit made at the time the application was submitted is non-refundable.

What happens if the trip is cancelled by the ESGVJCC?

Ten students is the minimum number of students needed to send to Japan. If the minimum number is not met, the program will be cancelled for the year and a full refund will be provided.
